
Let this brochure be a source of inspiration and a call to action—towards a more inclusive, empathetic, and equitable society.

at Jhadeswari Special School**

Before administering the medicine, the health officials explained the importance of taking the drug, its dosage, and the safety measures associated with it. Teaching methods are adapted to develop orientation, mobility, and independent living skills. The aim is to provide equal learning opportunities and promote self-reliance.



**Hearing Impaired**

Special Education for Hearing Impaired students involves tailored teaching methods to support those with partial or total hearing loss. It includes the use of sign language, lip reading, hearing aids, cochlear implants, and visual aids. Teachers use visual communication and specialized resources to help students develop language, speech, and communication skills. The goal is to ensure equal access to education and foster independence.



**Intellectual Disability**

Special Education for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities focuses on helping students with below-average intellectual functioning and limitations in adaptive behaviour. It includes individualized instruction, life skills training, and simple, structured learning approaches. Teaching is paced according to the student's ability, emphasizing practical knowledge, social skills, and independence. The aim is to help them live as independently and successfully as possible.



**Psychological Assessment**

Psychological Assessment of individuals with Intellectual Disabilities helps determine their level of cognitive functioning and adaptive behaviour. It includes tools like IQ tests (e.g., Wechsler or Stanford-Binet) and adaptive behaviour scales to assess skills in daily living, communication, and social interaction. The assessment helps in diagnosis, planning individualized education programs (IEPs), and providing appropriate support and interventions.





**SPECIAL EDUCATION**

**Physiotherapy**

Special Education for Visually Challenged focuses on helping students with partial or complete vision loss learn effectively. It includes the use of Braille, audio materials, tactile tools, and assistive technologies like screen readers. Teaching methods are adapted to develop orientation, mobility, and independent living skills. The aim is to provide equal learning opportunities and promote self-reliance.



**Speech Therapy**

Special Education for Hearing Impaired students involves tailored teaching methods to support those with partial or total hearing loss. It includes the use of sign language, lip reading, hearing aids, cochlear implants, and visual aids. Teachers use visual communication and specialized resources to help students develop language, speech, and communication skills. The goal is to ensure equal access to education and foster independence.



**Indore game hearing impaired**

Indoor Physical Games for Hearing Impaired Students focus on enhancing movement, coordination, and social interaction using visual signals instead of sound. Activities like musical chairs with lights, ball passing, relay races, and parachute games are adapted with visual cues and gestures. These games help improve physical fitness, teamwork, and confidence, ensuring inclusive and active participation.



**Game Intellectual Disability**

Indoor Physical Games for Students with Intellectual Disabilities are simple, structured activities that support motor skills, coordination, and social development. Games like ball toss, bean bag throw, bowling, and follow-the-leader are easy to understand and play. These games promote participation, confidence, and physical activity in a safe and supportive environment.





### Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (DMD)

Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy is a severe, progressive genetic disorder that causes muscle weakness and degeneration. Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (DMD) is a severe, inherited muscle-wasting disorder caused by an X-linked mutation that leads to the absence of dystrophin, a protein essential for muscle strength. Symptoms begin in early childhood with delayed walking, frequent falls, and enlarged calves, followed by progressive weakness that leads to loss of walking ability in early adolescence. Over time, the heart and respiratory muscles also weaken, leading to serious complications. Although there is no cure, treatments like steroids, physiotherapy, cardiac care, and newer genetic therapies help slow progression and improve quality of life.

#### 1. Cause and Genetics

- **Inheritance pattern: X-linked recessive**
  - Primarily affects boys; girls can be carriers and rarely show symptoms.
- **Gene involved: Mutation in the DMD gene on the X chromosome.**
- **Protein affected: Dystrophin**
  - A structural protein needed to protect muscle fibres during contraction.
  - In DMD, dystrophin is completely absent, causing muscle cell damage and early cell death.



#### 2. Pathophysiology (What happens in the body)

- Lack of dystrophin → muscle fibres break easily → chronic inflammation → replacement with fat and fibrous tissue.
- Progressive loss of:
  - i) Skeletal muscle
  - ii) Heart muscle (leading to cardiomyopathy)
  - iii) Respiratory muscles (leading to breathing difficulties)

#### 3. Symptoms

##### Early signs (ages 2–5)

- i) Delayed walking
- ii) Frequent falls
- iii) Difficulty running or jumping
- iv) Gowers' sign: using hands to push off the knees when standing up
- v) Enlarged calves (pseudohypertrophy) due to fat deposition

##### Progression (ages 6–12)

- i) Increasing muscle weakness
- ii) Difficulty climbing stairs
- iii) Waddling gait
- iv) Loss of ability to walk **usually occurs by ages 10–12**

- i) Adolescence and Adulthood
- ii) Respiratory failure (due to diaphragm weakness)
- iii) Cardiomyopathy and arrhythmias
- iv) Scoliosis
- v) Contractures (tightening of joints)

#### 4. Diagnosis

- i) Blood test: Extremely high CK (creatine kinase) levels
- ii) Genetic testing: Confirms DMD gene mutation
- iii) Muscle biopsy: Shows absent dystrophin (less common now due to genetic tests)
- iv) Heart evaluation: Echocardiogram, ECG
- v) Lung function tests

#### 5. Treatment (Management, not a cure)

##### Medications

- i) Corticosteroids (prednisone, deflazacort): slow muscle degeneration
- ii) Exon-skipping therapy for specific mutations (e.g., eteplirsen)
- iii) Cardiac medications for cardiomyopathy

#### 6. Supportive care

- i) Physiotherapy to maintain mobility
- ii) Orthotic devices (braces)
- iii) Respiratory support (non-invasive ventilation)
- iv) Heart monitoring and treatment
- v) Nutritional support
- vi) Emerging treatments
- vii) Gene therapy (micro-dystrophin delivery)
- viii) Stem cell research (under development)

#### 7. Prognosis

- i) DMD is progressive and currently incurable.
- ii) Life expectancy has improved with modern care.
- iii) With good cardiac and respiratory support, many individuals live into their 20s, 30s, or beyond.





**NIRAMAYA SCHEME UNDER NATIONAL TRUST**

**(for the welfare of Autism, cerebral palsy, intellectual disability (MR), and multiple disabilities)**

**(Aegis of Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment Govt. of India )**

➤ **What is Niramaya**

Niramaya is a special health-insurance scheme for persons with disabilities (PwDs), launched under the National Trust .It aims to provide affordable and comprehensive health coverage to persons with developmental disabilities such as autism, cerebral palsy, intellectual disability (MR), and multiple disabilities, as defined under the National Trust Act.

➤ **Who is Eligible**

- Any person with a valid disability certificate under the National Trust Act is eligible.
- There is no discrimination based on age or type of covered disability — the scheme uses a single premium across all age bands and offers the same coverage for all eligible disabilities.
- Enrollment must be via a Registered Organisation (RO) of the National Trust or other authorized agency.

➤ **What Does It Cover — Benefits & Coverage**

Under Niramaya, a beneficiary gets up to ₹1,00,000 per year (on reimbursement basis) for various medical needs.

➤ **Major benefits include:**

➤ **No Pre-Conditions — What Makes It Easy & Inclusive**

- There is no need for pre-insurance medical tests. This simplifies access and reduces barrier for PwDs.
- The scheme does not exclude pre-existing conditions: persons with disabilities get coverage even if they already have disability from birth (congenital) or it existed previously.
- Beneficiaries are free to get treatment at any hospital or clinic (not limited to a fixed network).

➤ **Cost to Beneficiary (Premium / Fee)**

- The scheme comes at a nominal annual premium/ fee, making it affordable for low-income and economically weaker families.
- As reported: For persons below poverty line (BPL), or lower income, fee might be lower; for others slightly higher — but still modest compared to private insurance.

➤ **What is Needed to Enroll**

To apply under Niramaya, a beneficiary (or their guardian) must submit:

- A valid disability certificate / PwD certificate under National Trust Act (with UID/UDID or enrolment number)
- Required application via a Registered Organisation (RO) associated with the National Trust (or other authorised agency)
- Additional documents as per state/RO requirements (often: identity proof, address proof, bank details, disability-certificate, etc.)

➤ **Why It Matters — Importance and Impact**

- This scheme ensures persons with disabilities get access to healthcare — including therapy, surgeries, hospitalization, and regular medical care — without the burden of high cost. Because it covers pre-existing and congenital disabilities and doesn't demand pre-tests, it helps many who otherwise would be excluded by private insurers. The uniform coverage and modest premium make it more inclusive and equitable. It reduces the financial burden on families of PwDs and encourages regular health check-ups, therapies, and preventive care — improving overall health and quality of life.
